PUBLIC EDUCATION

Public kindergarten or elementary school students must complete a physical health screening before attending school. The state of Virginia has vaccine requirements for school entry. Depending on a child's immunization status at the time of entry, they may be eligible for a waiver to start school with proof of an upcoming medical appointment.
