

Guide to School Enrollment in the U.S.

1. Understand the Education Levels in the U.S.:

Education in the United States is divided into the following levels:

- **Preschool (Ages 3–5):** Optional
 - **Elementary School (Grades K–5):** Required
 - **Middle School (Grades 6–8):** Required
 - **High School (Grades 9–12):** Required
 - **School Attendance:** Children between the ages of **5 and 18** (varies by state) are required to attend school.
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2. Find Your Local School:

- Visit your **local school district’s website** or contact the district office to confirm which school is assigned to your child based on your home address.
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3. Complete Enrollment Forms:

- **Forms can be completed online** through the district’s website or obtained in person at the district office.
- Ensure all sections are filled out accurately.
- **Attached Required Documents:** including Proof of Residency: Such as a lease agreement, utility bill, or any official mail showing your current address, Child’s Birth Certificate and Immunization Records (from USA)
- **Check with the school district** for any additional requirements, as each district may have specific guidelines.

Guide to ESL (English as a Second Language) Classes in the U.S.

- **Immigrants and refugees**
 - **Non-native English speakers**

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How to Find an ESL Program:

1. Search for Local ESL Programs:

- Look for available ESL classes in your area through **community colleges, adult education centers, or non-profit organizations.**
- For example, if you are searching for programs in your city, such as **Alameda**, you can search for “**Alameda Community College – ESL**” on Google. This will direct you to their website, which may offer an enrollment guide, such as “**How to Enroll in ESL – Alameda Adult School.**”

2. Explore Local Listings:

- Once on the website, navigate to sections like “**ESL**” or “**Enrollment**” to find information about class schedules and registration
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How to Enroll in ESL Classes:

1. Register:

- Many ESL programs offer both **online** and **in-person** registration options.
- Be sure to gather any necessary documents required for enrollment, such as **proof of residency** (e.g., utility bill or lease agreement) and **identification** (e.g., passport, driver’s license).

2. Assessment:
