

Selective Service Register and Change of Address

If you are between the ages of 18-25 at the time of arrival, your IRC caseworker will complete the initial Selective Service Registration for you. However, if you have a son, it is his responsibility to register for Selective Service when he turns 18.

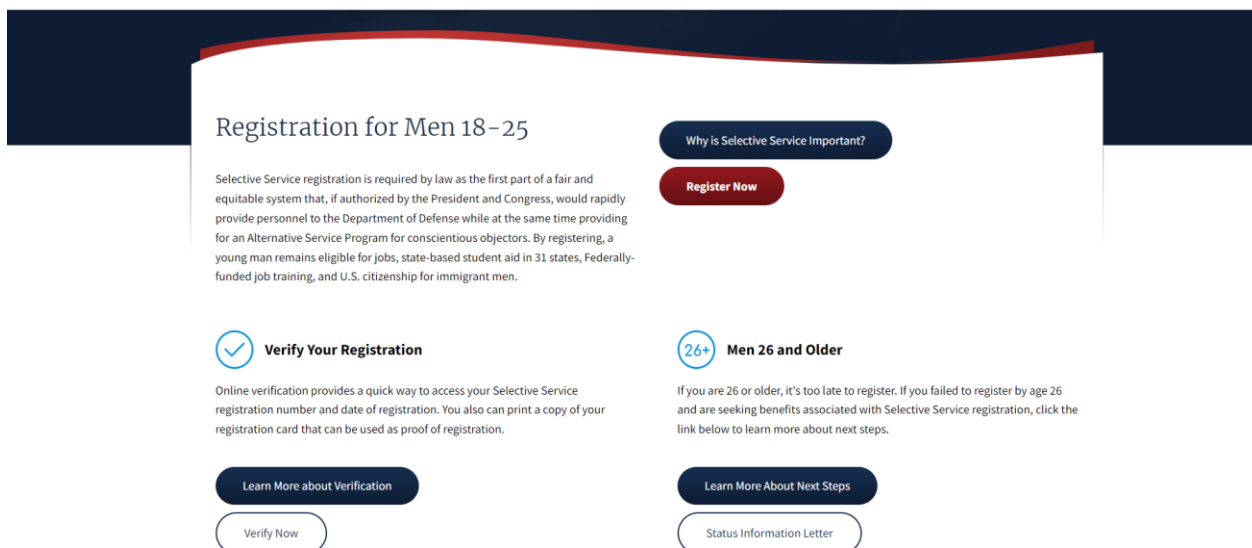
It is also important that when you move you fill out the change of address for Selective Service until the age of 25. Below are the instructions to register and change your address for Selective Service.

To Register:

To begin you can either search Selective Service in Google or type in <https://www.sss.gov/>. This is the main home screen.



If you have never registered, scroll down until you see this screen. And select register now.



Scroll until you see this. Complete all of the sections and hit the blue register button.

While there is currently no draft, registration with the Selective Service System is the most publicly visible program during peacetime that ensures operational readiness in a fair and equitable manner. If authorized by the President and Congress, our Agency would rapidly provide personnel to the Department of Defense while at the same time providing an Alternative Service Program for conscientious objectors.

Federal Law requires nearly all male US citizens and male immigrants, 18 through 25, register
